Dear Ms. Dortch,

This letter is to advise you, in accordance with the Commission's rules, that on September 19, 2014, Chris Riley of Mozilla met with Nicholas Degani, Legal Advisor to Commissioner Pai.

The substance of our presentation was consistent with the petition submitted by Mozilla to the Commission on May 5, 2014 and comments and reply comments filed by Mozilla, all included in the above referenced dockets. We discussed Mozilla's proposal for legal articulation of a new category of telecommunications services, Remote End Point (REP) services, offered to edge providers, including the scope of the REP service; statutory terms including "for a fee" and Mozilla's previous filings offering our interpretation in the context of REP services; our position on forbearance; and our understanding of the legal possibility of defining Title II REP services on both fixed and mobile networks. We also discussed the issue of prioritization and Mozilla's position that the Commission should adopt a presumption against such practices, explaining our core view that competition, choice, and innovation would be greatly harmed without such a presumption. Finally, we discussed Mozilla's position that the Commission should apply the same rules to mobile services while structuring a reasonable network management exception to permit appropriate engineering practices.
