Dear Ms. Dortch:

On Thursday, October 16, 2014, the Telecommunications Industry Association ("TIA") met with Federal Communications Commission's ("Commission") Office of Engineering and Technology ("OET"). The purpose of this meeting was for TIA to discuss process-related issues under the above-referenced dockets related to human exposure to radio frequency electromagnetic fields.¹

TIA urged for the Commission to move swiftly to resolve the pending petition for reconsideration submitted by the American Association for Justice² to the Commission's March 2013-released Report & Order which clarified consideration of the pinna (outer ear) as an extremity. TIA reiterated its view that the Petition should be immediately dismissed due it being procedurally insufficient, as well as applying an improper standard of review of the Commission's R&O.³

Consistent with TIA's views, ⁴ TIA further urged for the Commission to move forward as soon as possible to resolve the pending FNPRM and NOI.
