**Re: *Revision of Part 15 of the Commission's Rules to Permit
Unlicensed National Information Infrastructure (U-NII)
Devices in the 5 GHz Band, ET Docket No. 13-49

Dear Ms. Dortch:

On October 27, 2014, Cambium Networks, Ltd. ("Cambium") met via telephone with the Office of Engineering and Technology's Julius Knapp, Mark Settle, Aole Wilkins and Karen Rackley. Representing Cambium were Nigel King, Chief Technology Officer; Mark Thomas, Systems Engineering Manager; and Cambium's counsel, David Kaufman and Jonathan Allen of Rini O'Neil, PC.

The call concerned the FCC's decision in this proceeding to tighten the Out-of-Band Emissions Limit for devices operating at 5.725-5.825 GHz, for which Cambium filed a Petition for Reconsideration. At the invitation of OET, the Cambium's technical team has worked toward a compromise proposal to provide protection against harmful interference to federal facilities, particularly to Terminal Doppler Weather Radar ("TDWR") facilities. In the call, Cambium described potentially using technical and registration techniques to limit the operation of high-power devices in this band in and around TDWR installations.

Cambium agreed to further refine its proposals and to circulate them to key industry members with an eye toward submitting more formal proposals to the Office of Engineering and Technology in the coming weeks.
