REQUEST FOR EXTENSION OF TIME

CBS Corporation, Discovery Communications, LLC, Scripps Networks Interactive, Inc., The Walt Disney Company, Time Warner Inc., TV One, LLC, Twenty First Century Fox, Inc., Univision Communications Inc., and Viacom Inc., together and respectively on behalf of their affiliated businesses (collectively, the “Content Companies”), respectfully request a brief extension of time, until November 10, 2014, to respond to one of the two oppositions to the Content Companies’ Application for Review in the captioned proceedings (the “Proceedings”). The requested extension will enable the Content Companies to submit a consolidated reply to the two oppositions filed in this matter.

On October 7, 2014, the Media Bureau issued an Order, DA 14-1463, and associated Modified Joint Protective Orders, DA 14-1464 (14-57) and DA 14-1465 (14-90) in

the Proceedings (collectively, the “Orders”).¹ On October 14, 2014, pursuant to Section 1.115 of the Commission’s Rules, the Content Companies filed an Application for Review of the Orders and an accompanying emergency request to stay the Orders.² Under the Commission’s rules, oppositions to the Application for Review were due by no later than October 29, 2014.

Two oppositions to the Application for Review and Emergency Stay Request have been filed. AT&T and DIRECTV jointly filed an opposition on October 27, 2014.³ DISH Network filed an opposition on October 29, 2014.⁴ The AT&T/DIRECTV Opposition and the DISH Opposition raise similar arguments.

Pursuant to Section 1.115 of the Commission’s rules, replies to oppositions to applications for review must be filed within 10 days after an opposition is filed. 47 C.F.R. § 1.115(d). The Content Companies’ reply to the AT&T/DIRECTV Opposition is due on November 6, 2014, and their reply to the DISH Opposition is due on November 10, 2014.

The Content Companies therefore respectfully request that the Commission extend the deadline to file their reply to the AT&T/DIRECTV Opposition by two business days, until November 10, 2014, in order to permit the Content Companies to file a single, consolidated reply to the AT&T/DIRECTV Opposition and the DISH Opposition. Grant of the requested extension will not delay the Commission's consideration of this matter and would serve the public interest by promoting administrative convenience and efficiency.

Counsel for AT&T have advised the undersigned that the transaction parties in MB Docket No. 14-90 do not consent to this request for a brief extension of time.
