AeroMobile Communications Limited (“AeroMobile”) respectfully submits this notice of *ex parte* communication in the record of the above-captioned proceeding to facilitate the introduction of in-flight mobile connectivity (“IMC”) using airborne access systems (“AASs”). On November 3, 2014, Jessica Elder of LMI Advisors and the undersigned counsel to AeroMobile talked by telephone with Brian Regan, Senior Legal and Policy Advisor, Office of the Bureau Chief, Wireless Telecommunications Bureau.

During the call, AeroMobile representatives discussed the relative merits of authorizing AAS operations under Parts 87 and 15 of the FCC Rules, potential approaches to authorizing IMC on domestic and foreign aircraft, incorporation of applicable technical standards in the FCC’s rules or as conditions in AAS authorizations, and IMC operations on spectrum allocated to government and non-government users. AeroMobile representatives underscored that the Commission may facilitate the operation of AASs onboard foreign airlines that already offer IMC to their passengers while allowing interested parties to develop recommendations for the provision of IMC on U.S. domestic airlines.
