HILTON WORLDWIDE, INC. WITHDRAWAL OF OBJECTIONS

On October 17, 2014, October 22, 2014, and October 24, 2014, Hilton Worldwide, Inc. (“Hilton”), pursuant to the Modified Joint Protective Order, DA 14-1465, released October 7, 2014, in the above referenced proceeding (“MJPO”), filed objections (the “Objections”) to the disclosure of certain Highly Confidential Information and Stamped Highly Confidential Documents (the “Hilton Highly Confidential Information”) to various parties (the “Requesting Parties”) in this proceeding.

On October 31, 2014, by letter to the Commission, and in response to advice from Commission Staff that certain material that it had submitted was non-responsive to the Commission’s Information and Discovery Request, AT&T withdrew various exhibits from its response to the Information and Discovery Request, and hence from the record in this proceeding. The Hilton Highly Confidential Information was among the exhibits withdrawn.


Since the Hilton Highly Confidential Information has been withdrawn from the record in this proceeding, the Requesting Parties will no longer potentially have access to the Hilton Highly Confidential Information under the MJPO, and accordingly, Hilton withdraws its Objections as moot. This withdrawal is without prejudice to Hilton’s

renewing its objection should any portion of the Hilton Highly Confidential Information or any similar Hilton-related information or documents be later entered into the record herein, or should any Requesting Party or any other party seek access to any such information or documents through any other channel.
