SECTION 63.71 APPLICATION

Bresnan Broadband of Wyoming, LLC ("Bresnan"), through its undersigned counsel and pursuant to Section 214 of the Communications Act of 1934, as amended, 47 U.S.C. § 214, and Section 63.71 of the Commission's rules, 47 C.F.R. § 63.71, hereby files this Application to discontinue offering a certain discounted interconnected VoIP service in the State of Wyoming.

In support of its Application, Bresnan submits the following information:

Name and address of carrier:

This Application is submitted by Bresnan Broadband of Wyoming, LLC, whose principal address is:

Date of planned service discontinuance

Bresnan intends to discontinue offering the service described in this Application to new customers on December 1, 2014 or as soon thereafter as federal approval may be obtained.

Bresnan has no current plans to discontinue the service to its existing customers.

Points of geographic areas of service affected

Bresnan currently offers the service that is the subject of this Application in parts of the State of Wyoming (the "Service Area").

Brief description of the type of service affected

Bresnan proposes to discontinue offering to new customers a discounted interconnected VoIP service that is marketed to qualifying residential customers as Telephone Assistance Program service in Wyoming. This service provides local calling at a discounted rate. Bresnan has no current plans to discontinue the service to its existing customers.

Bresnan provides residential voice communication services exclusively in the form of interconnected VoIP service. Bresnan is a state-certificated competitive local exchange carrier that historically has offered the subject service as a tariffed local exchange service pursuant to requirements of Wyoming state law. Effective July 1, 2013, the State of Wyoming deregulated interconnected VoIP services by statute, as a result of which Bresnan is no longer required to offer this discounted service. Bresnan is not an eligible telecommunications carrier and does not receive state or federal reimbursement for discounting the price of this service. Similar discounted services are available in the Service Area from incumbent local exchange carriers and other eligible telecommunications carriers.

Brief description of the dates and methods of notice to all affected customers

Bresnan has not provided any customer notices because there are no affected customers. Bresnan proposes only to discontinue offering the affected service to new customers. Bresnan intends to continue providing the affected service to its existing customers at the same rates, terms and conditions at which it currently provides the service to those customers until individual customers voluntarily terminate their service or until service to individual customers is terminated for non-payment or violation of the terms of service. Both before and after

discontinuance, existing customers will have the ability to add or remove vertical features on an *a la carte basis* and to select an interexchange carrier of their choice to the same extent that they do today, although the nature of the service itself (which includes only specific enumerated features) limits the changes that customers may currently make without selecting a different Bresnan service. In the event that Bresnan in the future decides to discontinue providing the affected service to its then-existing customers, it will provide the then-existing customers with appropriate notice and submit a Section 63.71 application for authority to do so.

Non-dominance of the carrier with respect to the service to be discontinued

The services to be discontinued are interconnected VoIP services. Accordingly, Bresnan is non-dominant with respect to the services as a matter of law.



Conclusion

The public convenience and necessity will not be adversely affected by the discontinuance of the offering of this service because no existing customer will be affected and comparable services are available from other providers in the market. Bresnan respectfully requests that the Commission approve its Section 63.71 Application to discontinue offering discounted local interconnected VoIP service marketed as Telephone Assistance Program service to new customers in the State of Wyoming.


