Dear Ms. Dortch:

On Monday, November 3, 2014, James Cicconi, AT&T Senior Executive Vice President, External and Regulatory Affairs and I, had a conversation with Philip Verveer, Senior Counselor to the FCC Chairman regarding the aforementioned proceeding.

During the conversations, we reiterated AT&T's position that the Commission has the authority to protect and promote the open Internet under section 706 of the Communications Act by prohibiting paid prioritization which harms consumers or competition. In addition, we also explained that regulating broadband services or interconnection under Title II of the Communications Act would be inconsistent with Commission precedent and would negatively impact broadband infrastructure investment in a manner that would be counter-productive to the Commission's and Administration's goal of making high speed broadband universally available in the United States.

In accordance with the Commission's rules, this letter is being filed electronically with the Secretary for inclusion in the public record.
