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Hello, E-Rate Data Team!

In case you are still making updates to the fiber map, I noticed two of our schools which had previously been listed as 100% fiber are no longer.

They are:

St. John USD 350 – listed as 54% fiber – They have FTTP to the elementary school, middle school, and high school.

Lewis USD 502 – listed as 0% fiber – They have FTTP to the elementary school and middle school. There no longer is a high school at Lewis.

So if you are still making updates to the map, both school districts should be listed as 100% fiber. Thank you!

Thank you so much for your email, as this totally explains the discrepancies. So here is clarification on our schools, taking into account their buildings:

LaCrosse USD 395 –FTTP to the high school and middle school, with the elementary school connected via a fiber WAN.

Macksville USD 351 – FTTP to the elementary school, middle school, and high school.

Ness City USD 303 – FTTP to the elementary school, middle school, and high school.

Otis-Bison USD 403 – FTTP to the elementary school, middle school, and high school.

Western Plains USD 106 – FTTP to the elementary school, middle school, and high school. Buildings are located in both Ransom and Bazine.

Hi Kara,

We took a look at what's happening in the schools mentioned below. For example, Lacrosse School District has 3 schools and we have the high school marked as having fiber based the NCES school ID below. The elementary and middle schools are marked as no fiber and unknown, respectively.

Lacrosse School District (ID: 2008220)

- Elementary School (ID: 200822000889)
- Middle School (ID: 200822000891)
- High School (ID: 200822000890)

The map rolls up the individual school statuses to the district level, so based on the above data, the Lacrosse School District is 33% served. Does Golden Belt provide fiber to each of the three schools in the district (i.e., each school is served with FTTP or one school has fiber Internet access and the others are connected via fiber WAN)? If so, please let us know about this one and the other districts.

Dear E-Rate Data Team:

After reviewing the updated Fiber Map, there are some discrepancies between the information we submitted 8/21/14 (attached) and the figures on the map. All of the schools we serve are 100% connected by fiber, but only 4 of our schools show as 100% fiber connected on the updated map. Here is a breakdown of the needed corrections:

LaCrosse USD 395, NCES ID 200822000890 – 100% Fiber Access, not 32.8%
Macksville USD 351, NCES ID 200906000713 – 100% Fiber Access, not 33.3%
Ness City USD 303, NCES ID 200993000500 – 100% Fiber Access, not 50.3%
Otis-Bison USD 403, NCES ID 200402000923 – 100% Fiber Access, not 50%
Western Plains USD 106, NCES ID 200002000498 (Ransom) and NCES ID 200002000501 (Bazine) – 100% Fiber Access, not 77.8%
