This is to notify you pursuant to Section 1.1206 of the Commission's Rules and in connection with the above-referenced proceedings that on November 6, 2014 that Allan Bakalar from PT Access Networks, Karen Flewharty from Oncor Electric Delivery, Carl Nichols from Duke Energy Corporation, Sheila Wells from Nashville Electric Service and Ken Hill from PPL Services Corporation, as well as the undersigned and Eric Wagner from the Utilities Telecom Council (UTC) met with Donald Johnson, Erica Rosenberg, Jeff Steinberg, Jill Springer and Stephen DeSordo of the Wireless Telecommunications Bureau.

During the meeting, the participants discussed the recent Report and Order (FCC 14-153) regarding wireless infrastructure siting and its impact on utility wireless collocation. The participants stated that the new rules would promote wireless infrastructure deployment by utilities and commercial communications service providers by excluding certain facilities from routine environmental and historical review, including collocations on utility structure, and by clarifying certain terms of Section 6409(a) of the Spectrum Act (*i.e.* the Middle Class Tax Relief and Job Creation Act of 2012) and Section 332(c)(7) of the Communications Act. The participants reported on related developments regarding wireless infrastructure siting, including working with tribal authorities and access to Federal lands. The positions of the participants expressed during the meeting were consistent with the comments filed on the record by UTC.
