Pursuant to Section 64.1120(e)(1) of the Commission's Rules, Northeast Nebraska Telephone Company ("NNTC"), provides notice that on or about December 31, 2014, it will have transferred the subscriber base of Clarks Telecommunications Co. ("Clarks"), and will become the local exchange service provider for those customers who are currently served by Clarks.¹ The customers of Clarks will become customers of NNTC, except for those subscribers who exercise their right to select another local service provider.

NNTC certifies that on or about November 6, 2014, it provided advanced subscriber notice in accordance with Section 64.1120(e)(3), and that it will comply with the obligations specified in that section and all other applicable and Commission requirements. A copy of the notice is attached.



¹ NNTC will be accomplishing this transfer as part of an overall corporate reorganization where Clarks, which is currently wholly-owned by NNTC, will be merged into NNTC with no change in control of NNTC. Clarks only provides local exchange services to end user subscribers, which will continue to be provided by NNTC under the same terms and conditions pursuant to which Clark's subscribers currently receive service.

Re: Notice of Change of Local Exchange Carrier

Dear Clarks Telecommunications Company Customer:

As you may recall, in 2007 Northeast Nebraska Telephone Company ("NNTC") became the ultimate owner of Clarks Telecommunications Co. ("Clarks"), your provider of local exchange telephone service. In order to continue to improve the method by which we serve our customers, and to make such changes that, in our view, streamline and improve the process by which our telecommunications services are provided, NNTC will be merging the local exchange carrier operations of Clarks into NNTC's operations at the end of this year. As of December 31, 2014, therefore, NNTC will become your provider of the local exchange telephone services now provided to you by Clarks.

Our commitment to provide you with quality local exchange telephone services will continue. Prior to and immediately following the transfer, you will continue to receive the same local exchange services at the same rates, terms, and conditions as you do now. Notice of any future changes in rates, terms, and conditions of service will be provided to you as required by law. Service will continue without interruption. You will incur no carrier change charges as a result of this transaction.

If you want to subscribe to a different local exchange service carrier before December 31, 2014 and such carrier is available, you are entitled to do so. Please contact our customer service at 888-397-4321 to make any such change. If you decide to change such local exchange carrier before December 31, 2014, NNTC will be responsible for any carrier change charges associated with that change. Absent hearing from you before December 31, 2014, your local service account will automatically be transferred to NNTC on that date.

Please also note that NNTC will be responsible for addressing any complaints you may have regarding services provided by it on and after December 31, 2014, as well as complaints that arise prior to that date with respect to the local exchange services provided by Clarks.
