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Keep the Internet and World Wide Web a level playing field. Allowing major telecom (ISP) companies to determine how bandwidth is utilized is not fair to the end consumer. Telecoms' (ISP's) sell different products meant for different purposes. "Cable" and "Satellite" packages are sold with the express understanding of which channels and content will be provided. The consumer can choose to watch or not watch a specific show and switch channels at will without interruption of service. Internet "access" is sold with the express understanding and expectation that it is only a portal to the world wide web. I do not expect to always go to specific websites. Allowing ISP's to direct bandwidth for certain websites hinders the consumer's ability to navigate the internet. The consumer has no ability to "change the channel". This in turn constitutes an interruption of service.
