On Thursday, November 13, 2014, the California Emerging Technology Fund (CETF) provided individual telephone briefings with Commissioner Pai's Legal Advisor Nicolas Degani and Commissioner Rosenworcel's Policy Director Clint Odom. CETF President and CEO Sunne Wright McPeak spoke with Mr. Odom and CETF Senior Vice President updated Mr. Degani.

The conversations revisited 5 CETF recommendations that the FCC Commissioners secure a **public benefit** from the Comcast TWC proposed merger: ensure acceptable Comcast Internet Essentials (CIE) performance; expand eligibility to include all low-income households; set performance goals; capitalize an independent fund and mandate States coordination; establish an independent advisory oversight committee; and require CIE to offer stand-alone Internet service.

CETF also provided details to Mr. Odom and Mr. Degani about the current CETF social media program and activities.
