**Comments of Robert Biggerstaff on the Petition for Exemption of the American
Bankers Association**

On October 14, 2014, the American Bankers Association (the Association) filed a petition for exemption requesting that the Commission exempt “certain time-sensitive informational calls, placed without charge to the called parties, from the Telephone Consumer Protection Act’s restrictions on automated calls to mobile devices.”¹ On November 6, 2014, the Consumer and Governmental Affairs Bureau issued a *Public Notice*² opening a comment period on the *Petition*.

However, this *Public Notice* does not appear on the TCPA docket (02-278) when searching that docket in ECFS. Since many commenters and interested parties monitor the ECFS for TCPA-related notices, I respectfully request that the Bureau include this *Public*
