Dear Ms. Dortch,

On Tuesday, December 2, 2014, representatives from wireless carriers AT&T Mobility, Sprint, T-Mobile, Verizon, and CTIA—The Wireless Association®, met with representatives from the Federal Communications Commission to discuss the Commission's above-captioned proceeding. The list of representatives attending the meeting appears in Attachment A.

During the meeting, CTIA noted that the wireless industry has worked diligently with correctional institutions to put an end to the use of contraband wireless devices in prisons. Wireless providers have a strong record of cooperating with managed access and cell detection vendors in several states.

The parties discussed wireless providers' experiences with interdiction technologies in several states, including complex questions raised by the use of cell detection systems as a means of combating the use of contraband cell phones in correctional facilities. CTIA and providers shared their views regarding the need for a court order to terminate service to a contraband device. CTIA and providers further underscored the value of effective certification and validation processes that will verify that a cell detection system is properly functioning and providing accurate and complete data that a court could rely upon in directing a wireless provider to terminate service to a wireless device.
