

I, Richard Bellizzi, am inquiring as to the status of the aforementioned petition for reconsideration, filed on April 18, 2014. The last activity on file is our Supplement to reply to opposition to petition for reconsideration. We have had no further correspondence and would like to know what the status of the ruling is, or when it might be made. It has been 15 months since our original filing requesting must carry.

In order to make it easier for Comcast to grant our Must Carry request, we are willing to waive compensation for our programming and instead, we would accept a permanent rebroadcast agreement. We understand that Comcast does not wish to compensate LPTV stations for their programming content which is amenable to us. We were operating with a rebroadcast agreement prior to our requesting must carry, which Comcast revoked when we made our must carry request. The two other full power stations already granted must carry in the county of origin are Spanish language, we are the only English language station requesting carriage and, as we have previously mentioned, we do, indeed, meet all other requirements for must carry.

I understand there are things going on at this time in preparation for the spectrum auction. We appreciate your protection of the LPTV station Class A licenses. We would appreciate anything that can be done to protect the LPTV stations that are not Class A. Our license is not in jeopardy, as we are 150 miles away from the main metropolitan area, (Miami), which is part of the spectrum auction area. Our RF Channel is Channel 19 which should not be affected. I understand also that you will be dealing with issues concerning the internet net neutrality.

Thank you for your consideration and for your protection of television broadcasters wishing to continue broadcasting to service their local communities, and who do not wish to sell their license as part of the spectrum auction.
