I was the County Sheriff in Madison County, Ohio, for 25 years and served as the chairman of the review board that brought 9-1-1 service to our county many years ago. People believe that when they are in an emergency situation, the dispatcher on the other end of the line will be able to help them, no matter the circumstance.

In a time where cell phone use is increasing and landline use is decreasing, it is imperative that the technology associated with the 9-1-1 services be redesigned to fit the world in which we live. I was disappointed to hear that cell phone companies were not supportive of enhancing their location accuracy as it relates to emergency calls. I would strongly recommend that the Federal Communications Commission consider their original plan of ensuring the safety of all our citizens and support technology development that gives a physical address from cellular phones and landlines. A citizen's safety should not be determined based on the location of where they call 9-1-1.
