

Dear Ms. Dortch:

The undersigned and Reed Hundt, representing LightSquared, met with Jon Chambers, Chief of the Office of Strategic Plans and Policy Analysis; Ron Repasi, Deputy Chief of the Office of Engineering and Technology (by phone); Charles Mathias, Associate Bureau Chief of the Wireless Telecommunications Bureau; Paul Murray, Assistant Bureau Chief of the Wireless Telecommunications Bureau; and Jennifer Tatel, Associate General Counsel of the Office of General Counsel, on December 16 to review the company's use of the L-Band spectrum. The parties discussed the characteristics and operations of L-Band licensees at different parts of the band and how that activity affects neighboring uses. The parties also discussed the elements of harmful interference and the appropriate methods and means to assess harmful interference. Lastly, the parties urged Commission action on making certain government spectrum available to the private sector consistent with the President's budget and the recent Congressional enactment.
