Dear Secretary Dortch,

Law enforcement agencies rely on accurate information to locate individuals in emergency situations. Updating FCC standards to locate individuals who call 911 indoors from a wireless phone will increase law enforcements ability to save lives.

Not only will this benefit law enforcement in violent situations, but it will enable first responders to locate individuals in danger. When law enforcement does not have the ability to accurately pinpoint locations it can unnecessarily prolong rescue efforts. Updating the FCC regulations to mirror outdoor wireless emergency calls could greatly improve rescue efforts.

I believe that more can be done to ensure the deployment of effective indoor location technology that will meet the accuracy requirements of public safety. By updating federal regulation, the FCC can enable law enforcement to react more quickly in emergency situations and save lives.
