I also wish to cite the statement of the FCC Head of the enforcement bureau at the time of the \$600,000 fine levied against Marriott, which operates the Gaylord Opryland resort in Nashville. "Consumers who purchase cellular data plans should be able to use them without fear that their personal Internet connection will be blocked by their hotel or conference center."

Wi-Fi spectrum is a public and common resource granted for use by all, regardless of income or social standing. Allowing any organization to act as a mediator and controller of this public resource solely to give that organization the ability to sell the resource is contrary to the purpose of making this chunk of spectrum freely available to all.

I strongly oppose the action in its entirety, and request that the FCC take these and other arguments into consideration when making a decision on this proceeding.
