Dear Ms. Dortch:

On January 13, David Frankel deposed Dr. Henning Schulzrinne, currently employed as an FCC advisor and previously FCC CTO, as part of an on-going lawsuit pending in the United States Court of Federal Claims.

During the deposition, Mr. Frankel questioned Dr. Schulzrinne regarding robocalls and call-blocking solutions.

As part of the questioning, Mr. Frankel expressed his skepticism regarding the viability of blocking "solutions" that rely on calling-line identification (Caller-ID). He pointed to statements made by Dr. Schulzrinne and others indicating that such solutions would only be effective against "dumb robocallers" and that if such solutions were deployed at scale, robocallers would readily work around them.
