Re: Wireless E911 Location Accuracy Requirements, PS Docket No. 07-114

Dear Ms. Dortch:

On January 21, 2015, Kathleen Grillo and Donald Brittingham of Verizon spoke by telephone with Priscilla Delgado Argeris, legal advisor to Commissioner Jessica Rosenworcel, to discuss issues in the above-referenced proceeding. Verizon expressed its support for the modifications to the Roadmap submitted that day by the Roadmap's industry signatories.¹ Verizon explained that any rules the Commission adopts in this proceeding should promote the deployment of dispatchable location solutions to improve indoor 911 location accuracy through enforceable, feasible, and technology-neutral metrics while providing assurances that improved location accuracy (both horizontal and vertical) is achieved even if deployment of dispatchable location solutions does not occur.

In addition, on January 22, 2015, Mr. Brittingham spoke by phone with Rear Admiral (ret.) David Simpson, Chief, Public Safety and Homeland Security Bureau, regarding the January 21, 2015 modifications to the Roadmap concerning the deployment of vertical location solutions. Mr. Brittingham explained that any standard for vertical location accuracy should be based on the performance of vertical location solutions as demonstrated in an independent test bed.
