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**Response of Charter Communications, Inc. Regarding the Request of AT&T's to Modify Its
Connect America Phase I Incremental Broadband Deployment Plans**

Pursuant to the Bureau's Public Notice, *Wireline Competition Bureau Announces Deadline for Existing Providers to Notify AT&T That They Serve Census Blocks That AT&T Proposes to Serve with Connect America Phase I Incremental Support*, Public Notice, WC Docket No. 10-90, DA 15-118 (WCB rel. Jan 28, 2015), Charter Communications, Inc. ("Charter") hereby respectfully submits this response to AT&T's request to modify its Connect America Phase I Round 2 (Phase I) incremental broadband deployment plans.

On January 16, 2015, AT&T notified the Commission that it intended to modify its original Phase I incremental broadband deployment plans, and provided the Commission with a list of 7,931 census blocks that it intended to serve using Phase I support that were previously not identified in AT&T's initial election. In response to AT&T's requested modification, the Commission issued a Public Notice on January 28, 2015, requesting that other providers indicate whether they serve the newly-identified census blocks within 45 days. Charter has undertaken a rigorous review of the census blocks listed in AT&T's January 16th letter, and, based on its review, respectfully responds that it serves one of the census blocks at issue, Census Block 010830202023041.

Charter's review of its billing data revealed that it currently provides both voice services and broadband services greater than 3 Mbps downstream and 768 kbps upstream to customers located in Census Block 010830202023041. As evidence of its ability to serve customers in that block, Charter has

attached to this filing as Appendix A a representative bill for Census Block 010830202023041. To comply with applicable privacy statutes, including ECPA, Section 222 of the Telecommunications Act, and Section 631 of the Cable Act, Charter has redacted personally identifiable, or otherwise protected information, as well as non-relevant information from this representative bill. In addition, because of the rural nature of this census block, Charter was also required to redact the street name as well as the street address of the consumer.

Given that Charter has demonstrated that it currently can and does serve customers in this census block with voice and broadband services, providing AT&T Phase I incremental support to serve this census block would be inconsistent with the Commission's goals, skew competition, and waste scarce public resources. Accordingly, Charter respectfully notifies the Commission and AT&T that it serves Census Block 010830202023041 and requests that Phase I support is not used to deploy to this block.
