Re: Connect America Fund, WC Docket No. 10-90, Northland Cable Television, Inc. ("Northland")

Dear Ms. Henze:

On January 16, 2015 AT&T notified the Federal Communications Commission of its intent to modify its Connect America Fund (CAF) Phase 1 Round 2 incremental broadband deployment plans. On January 28, 2015 the Wireline Competition Bureau released a Public Notice announcing the deadline for existing providers to notify AT&T of any census blocks they currently service which have been included in AT&T's modified deployment plans.

By this letter, Northland is providing notice to AT&T of the census blocks currently served by Northland which have been included in AT&T's modified plans. The attachment to this letter identifies the relevant census blocks and describes the methodology Northland used in determining that the blocks at issue should be considered served by Northland.

A copy of this correspondence is also being filed with the FCC via its Electronic Comment Filing System (ECFS) in WC Docket No. 10-90. Please contact me should you have any questions regarding this notification.

Exhibit 1:

Northland Cable Television, Inc. (“Northland”) is providing this information in support of its notice to AT&T that Northland serves census blocks now being proposed to be served by AT&T with CAF Phase 1 incremental support.¹ As shown below and in Table 1, Northland is providing notification that it currently offers broadband service exceeding the 3Mbps/768Kbps speed threshold to subscribers within nine (9) census blocks now proposed to be served by AT&T as a result of modifications to its original broadband deployment plans.

Northland’s Process to Identify Served Areas:

For the purposes of this notification, Northland’s process to identify census blocks it currently serves is consistent with that used by Northland in filing previous challenges to census blocks proposed to be eligible for CAF support and includes the following processes.²

Northland first narrowed the census block list available via the Bureau’s January 28, 2015 Public Notice to focus only on states in which Northland provides service. Northland then compared the counties listed in AT&T’s request with the counties served by Northland. This initial step yielded 604 census blocks where potential overlap with Northland served areas could exist.

Northland next determined actual census block overlap. Northland compared the census block list to its (i) FCC Form 477 data, (ii) system maps depicting Northland’s service area, and (iii) homes passed data. Northland created maps of each of the overlapping areas that were within a reasonable circumference of its know service areas. Northland’s local technical staff looked at each census block identified in each map to determine if the census block depicted in the map was served by Northland’s facilities. After the local technical staff reviewed the maps and made their initial determination, Northland’s corporate office then reviewed each census block identified in order to confirm the presence of Northland facilities capable of meeting the FCC’s minimum performance criteria³. As a result of this effort, Northland identified active or serviceable addresses in nine (9) of the 7,931 census blocks in question.
