
On March 24, 2015, Michael Hurlston, DeAnn Work, Vinko Erceg, and Christopher Szymanski of Broadcom Corporation and I had separate meetings with Commissioner O'Rielly and Commissioner Clyburn. Commissioner O'Rielly was joined by his legal advisor Erin McGrath, and Commissioner Clyburn was joined by her senior legal advisor Louis Peraertz. On March 25, 2015, Michael Hurlston, DeAnn Work, and Christopher Szymanski of Broadcom Corporation and I also spoke with Commissioner Rosenworcel, who was joined by her senior legal advisor Priscilla Delgado Argeris.

Each of these conversations included a brief discussion of the Commission's ongoing proceeding to amend its Part 15 rules, noted above. We explained that the Commission's current proposals were reasonable, but somewhat conservative. In particular, we indicated that Broadcom's tests demonstrate that unlicensed devices can operate in 6 MHz channels within the duplex gap and guard bands at power levels greater than 40 mW as the Commission has proposed. We also pointed out that recent filings by Qualcomm and CTIA were based on incorrect assumptions and could not be replicated because crucial information was omitted from the filings. Finally, we expressed our view that the Incentive Auction Task Force and the Commission staff were handling these technical matters well and that the Commission should have confidence in their conclusions.
