Dear Ms. Dortch:

On March 25, 2015, Milo Medin and Paul Reddick of Google Inc. met with John Leibovitz and Paul Powell of the Wireless Telecommunications Bureau.

Mr. Medin and Mr. Reddick discussed the FCC's proposal to open up the 3550-3700 MHz band for sharing by commercial users. In particular, they urged the Commission to adopt rules without delay. Mr. Medin and Mr. Reddick also stressed that the Commission's framework should:

- Adhere to the three-tiered framework proposed by the President's Council of Advisors on Science and Technology (PCAST);
- Rely on a spectrum access system to manage coexistence among the three tiers of users;
- Establish interference protection requirements that take into account aggregation effects of secondary and tertiary usage; and
- Establish dynamic protection zones that protect incumbent operations when and where they are in use.
