Dear Ms. Dortch:

On April 28, 2015, Edgar Figueroa, President and CEO, Greg Ennis, Vice President, Technology, and Kelly Davis-Felner, Vice President, Marketing, all of Wi-Fi Alliance, and the undersigned counsel for Wi-Fi Alliance, met with Renee Gregory, Legal Advisor to Chairman Wheeler, and Priscilla Argeris, Senior Legal Advisor to Commissioner Rosenworcel. On April 29, we met with Erin McGrath, Legal Advisor to Commissioner O'Rielly, and Brendan Carr, Legal Advisor to Commissioner Pai.

In each meeting we discussed the above referenced proceeding. We noted the increased use of the 5 GHz band by Wi-Fi devices and that additional spectrum capacity in that band is required. We pointed out that the 5 GHz band can be used to help develop Internet of Things ("IoT") applications and for wideband devices that make use of IEEE 802.11(ac) standards. We urged the Commission to take action to make the 5850-5925 MHz band (the "5.9 GHz Band") available for unlicensed devices.
