RE: Petition for Rulemaking Filed by AT&T To Make 800 Cellular Base Station Power Rules Consistent with Rules for Other Mobile Broadband Services, WT Docket No. 12-40, RM-11660

Dear Ms. Dortch:

On May 6, 2015, Dave Pollard, Robert Vitanza (via telephone), Doug Duet (via telephone), Mike Roden (via telephone) and the undersigned met with Roger Noel, Bahman Badipour, Lloyd Coward, Tom Derenge, Michael Ha, Moslem Sawez, Nina Shafran, and Michael Wilhelm of the Federal Communications Commission to discuss AT&T's power spectral density ("PSD") study attached to its petition for rulemaking filed in this docket.

AT&T explained that the proposed PSD power limit, while not ideal for maximum LTE deployment, is based on many considerations including the impact on the potential for interference to current public safety devices. AT&T clarified that its proposed PSD power limit would be applied per sector, not per transmitter. AT&T also generally discussed its experiences responding to and resolving Part 90 licensee interference complaints.
