On Wednesday, May 6, 2015, John Snapp, Senior Technical Officer - Intrado, and Kim Robert Scovill, Vice President Governmental and External Affairs – Intrado, met with the following FCC Staff; David Furth, Tim May, Michael Connelly, Rasoul Safavian, Dana Zelman, and Erika Olsen, all from the Commission’s Public Safety and Homeland Security Bureau.

The discussion centered on Intrado’s review and continuing analysis of the FCC’s January 29, 2015 decision in the above-noted dockets.¹ Attendees discussed location technology issues related to the evolving concept of the national emergency “database” that is to be created as part of the new wireless 911 accuracy requirements in the Commission’s rules.

The discussion centered on the details in the attached slides presented at the meeting. Mr. Snapp used the slides to explain the various methods being explored by the industry to identify a “dispatchable” address – one of the major goals of the decision.
