I am commenting on the STELAR proceeding because I believe the FCC should change the "local into local" provision of this legislation, and make satellite carriage mandatory for in-state stations. Roughly 75% of the population of Wyoming, if they are on satellite, cannot receive any Wyoming stations - no weather, no news, no public affairs programming, no emergency broadcasts, and no in-state public television with our coverage of the state legislature, election debates, historical documentaries and other important Wyoming programming. It is such a disservice to our state's citizens. As the General Manager for Wyoming Public Television, Wyoming residents contact me nearly once a week asking "why can't they receive Wyoming Public Television on their satellite dish?" And we have to say, "because of the way markets were interpreted 50 years ago by Nielsen Research" - and carriage is determined by those very old rules. This is 2015 - and satellite companies can accommodate this request by zip code - Please make satellite carriage mandatory for in-state stations - both commercial and non-commercial - it is the RIGHT thing to do.
