On May 19, 2015, representatives of the Association of Public-Safety Communications Officials (APCO) International met with the following staff of the Public Safety and Homeland Security Bureau to discuss the above-referenced proceedings concerning the 4.9 GHz band: Rear Admiral (ret.) David Simpson, David Furth, Zenji Nakazawa, Rasoul Safavian, Renee Roland, and Thomas Eng. Derek Poarch, Farokh Latif, and the undersigned participated on APCO's behalf.

During this meeting, APCO reiterated its support for the NPSTC 4.9 GHz National Plan, and the value of an effective frequency coordination regime and a new database to manage use of the 4.9 GHz band.

APCO also discussed opportunities to increase public safety awareness and use of 4.9 GHz spectrum. In this regard, APCO noted that it has created a new 4.9 GHz Task Force that will operate from June 1, 2015 through August 31, 2015. The Task Force will be producing a White Paper outlining both current use cases and potential future uses of 4.9 GHz intended for submission to the FCC. The Task Force work product will also be used to promote expanding public safety's utilization of the spectrum.
