In the Matter of *The Petition of Care2, Inc. for the Use of an N11 code or other  
Abbreviated Dialing Code for Nationwide Suicide Prevention*

On May 22, 2015, David Naimon, Rina Hakimian, and Constance Foster of the United States Department of Health and Human Services' (HHS) Office of the General Counsel, and Kana Enomoto, Richard McKeon, Eileen Zeller, and Nevine Gahed of the HHS Substance Abuse and Mental Health Services Administration (SAMHSA), spoke by telephone with Ann Stevens, Heather Hendrickson, and Michelle Sclater of the Federal Communications Commission (FCC) Wireline Competition Bureau WCB to discuss the letter and petition sent to the FCC by Care2, Inc. and posted on April 9, 2015. The letter from Care2, Inc. posted on docket number 92-105, requests that the FCC allocate a three-digit number for suicide prevention services.

During this telephone meeting, SAMHSA representatives described the current services, function, and capacity of the toll free numbers utilized by the National Suicide Prevention Lifeline, and the ongoing work to support the stable, efficient, and publicly accessible system supported by SAMHSA.
