On May 28, 2015, Bert Gomez, Senior Vice President, Government Relations of Univision Communications Inc. and the undersigned met separately with Commissioner Jessica Rosenworcel and her policy advisor Valery Galasso; and with Chanelle Hardy, Legal Advisor to Commissioner Clyburn, to discuss the Commission's implementation of Section 111 of the STELA Reauthorization Act of 2014. We discussed the significant harm to Hispanic consumers that could result from a change in the rules that would leave every local franchise area in the country deemed subject to effective competition. We emphasized that Univision's viewers were especially vulnerable to being forced to pay more to get an additional tier if MVPDs had the latitude of taking this vital programming out of the basic tier package. The result would be increased cable rates across the country for Hispanic households. We further emphasized that Section 111 reflects Congress's clear and unambiguous intent to streamline the effective competition process for small cable systems only, and the Commission was not adhering to the will of Congress by adopting a presumption that applied to all cable systems.
