Re: Notice of Ex Parte Communication: *Office of Engineering and Technology and Wireless Telecommunications Bureau Seek Information on Current Trends in LTE-U and LAA Technology*, ET Docket No. 15-105

Dear Ms. Dortch:

On June 24, 2015, I met with John Leibovitz, Deputy Chief of the Wireless Telecommunications Bureau, and Ira Keltz, Deputy Chief of the Office of Engineering and Technology.

During the meeting, I emphasized that operators in the recently authorized Citizens Broadband Radio Service, in the 3550-3700 MHz band, should be afforded maximum flexibility to provide new and innovative wireless services. Rules for the band should be technology-neutral and should not hamper the use of any wireless access technology that complies with the Part 96 rules. In that regard, and specifically with regard to recent discussions surrounding the use of LTE in unlicensed spectrum, I noted that both Priority Access and General Authorized Access are licensed services under Part 96, operating pursuant to authorizations issued by a Spectrum Access System. There is no allocation for unlicensed use in the 3550-3700 MHz band.

Pursuant to the Commission's rules, this notice is being filed in the above-referenced docket for inclusion in the public record. Please contact me should you have any questions.
