**NOTICE OF ORAL EX PARTE PRESENTATION**

On Friday, June 26, 2015, representatives of AT&T Inc. (“AT&T”) and DIRECTV (collectively, the “Applicants”) had a telephone conference with Federal Communications Commission (“Commission”) staff to discuss AT&T’s proposed acquisition of DIRECTV. During the conference call, we discussed the substantial, direct, and verifiable benefits that the AT&T/DIRECTV merger will deliver to tens of millions of consumers. We also discussed Applicants’ voluntary commitments, described in the record,<sup>1</sup> which will provide the
