Re: FCC 690 Form - Tribal Lands Reporting

To Whom It May Concern:

In compliance with the requirements for the FCC 690 Form's Tribal Lands Reporting, we are submitting the following list of tribes, as well as dates and description of contacts made with these tribes. They were initially contacted during the application and award process, and when no responses were received, follow-up correspondence was sent October 12, 2012. As of December 31, 2014 we have received no follow-up correspondence from any of the Indian Nations.


Our new wireless build-out service area boundaries overlap with the Muscogee Nation of Oklahoma, the Choctaw Nation of Oklahoma, and the Seminole Nation of Oklahoma boundaries. Therefore, these tribes were each sent correspondence outlining the cooperative discussion prescribed in the FCC Form 690 guidelines.

In addition to the initial and follow-up correspondence sent to the above listed tribes, wireless site acquisition has included a NEPA Review for each proposed new tower site location. As part of the NEPA documentation, these tribes and any other tribes interested in these areas were notified through the FCC's Tower Site Notification System (TCNS) that new facilities will be placed within the boundaries of their tribal lands. While NEPA documentation satisfies the cultural and historic preservation requirements for consulting with the Tribes, it also serves as a general notification through TCNS and local public notices that provide additional methods of alerting the Tribes that new services will be available to their community members. Cross is building one (1) new site in SAC-438001 which provides coverage of SAC-439002, it has involved

NEPA reviews and, therefore, additional notification of potential new services in their communities.

Furthermore, as a participant in Verizon Wireless' LTE in Rural America Program, Cross Wireless will provide wireless broadband connectivity to the Creek Nation's youth center in Eufaula, Oklahoma. The program targets Tribal youth by also providing middle and high school students with tablets and hands-on training to use the devices for learning.
