On July 7, 2015, representatives of AT&T Inc. (“AT&T”) and DIRECTV had a telephone conference with Federal Communications Commission (“Commission”) staff to discuss AT&T’s proposed acquisition of DIRECTV. The following individuals participated in the meeting:

During the conference call, we discussed the substantial, direct, and verifiable benefits that the AT&T/DIRECTV merger will deliver to tens of millions of consumers. We also discussed AT&T’s voluntary commitments, described in the record,¹ which will provide the
