By this letter, we are advising you of the current status of your above-referenced petition for exemption from the Federal Communications Commission's (FCC's) closed captioning rules. On May 28, 2015, the Consumer and Governmental Affairs Bureau (the Bureau) advised you by letter that, absent further action on your part by June 29, 2015, the petition would be dismissed.

We received written notice from you by e-mail dated July 15, 2015, that you wished to withdraw your petition for exemption to our closed captioning requirements for your program as it has been discontinued. Accordingly, your petition has been withdrawn and dismissed without prejudice as of July 15, 2015.
