During the calls, the participants discussed the substantial, direct, and verifiable benefits that the AT&T/DIRECTV merger will deliver to tens of millions of consumers. The Commission should promptly approve the transaction so that consumers can begin to enjoy the resulting pro-competitive, public interest benefits.
