Over the past few months, the Commission's Office of Media Relations has received several thousand nearly identical emails from members of the public expressing views on issues related to the upcoming Broadcast Incentive Auction. In general, these emails urge the Commission to hold the Broadcast Incentive Auction in the near term and advocate for the Commission to reserve 40 megahertz or at least half of the available spectrum for companies other than Verizon and AT&T.

While parties did not officially submit these communications in the Commission's Electronic Comment Filing System, many of the emails indicated that they were being sent as a public comment in the above-referenced dockets. Accordingly, we here document these communications for the record in order to reasonably convey this additional public input received by Commission staff.
