On August 6, 2015, Dan Hackett and Dan DeCerbo of ShawnTech Communications, Inc. met with the following individuals with the Wireless Telecommunications Bureau: Lloyd Coward, Brian Regan, Roger Noel, Keith Harper, Keesha Lomax (by telephone) and the following individuals with Office of Engineering and Technology: Ronald Repasi, Bruce Romano, Nnake Nweke and with the Public Safety and Homeland Security Bureau: Zenji Nakazawa.

ShawnTech Communications, Inc. representatives provided an update on the current activities with the ShawnTech C5 Managed Access Solution. The update included a description of the status of ongoing projects with the Texas Department of Criminal Justice as well as discussion of other states contemplating such a system. Discussion ensued regarding ShawnTech's services to assist correctional agencies identify to identify and manage contraband wireless device as well as insight into best practices associated with this service.

The current rules and processes related to spectrum grants were discussed, noting that this is an area of increased activity. ShawnTech noted that its relationships with the carriers was positive and there were no issues in securing support from the carriers to support Managed Access applications.
