Please find enclosed the response to objections filed by the Georgetown Law Institute for Public Representation located at 600 New Jersey Avenue, NW, Suite 312, Washington D.C. 2001-2075, hereafter referred to as Consumer Groups.

Dear Ms. Dortch:

I object to the overall tone of the complaints filed by the Georgetown Law Institute for Public Representation (Consumer Groups) suggesting that the Seeking the Lost Ministries have been less than cooperative in supplying information to the FCC. The Seeking the Lost Ministries has provided all documents requested by the FCC, and has not failed to be cooperative in any instance. Consumer Groups stated "Consumer Groups cannot determine whether the relatively modest quoted captioning costs would be economically burdensome." The Seeking the Lost Ministries respectfully reminds the Consumer Groups that it is the FCC that will make the determination whether or not the "relatively modest" costs will be economically burdensome, not Consumer Groups.

The Seeking the Lost Ministries has already provided all information requested by the FCC regarding its financial status, it has never repeatedly refused to supply any request from the FCC. Consumer Groups argues that the contributing congregations should also submit a report on their financial status. Consumer Groups is reminded the Seeking the Lost Ministries is the petitioner in this case, and the supporting congregations are neither petitioners nor parties to this action. Demanding a report on the financial status of these congregations is unreasonable. The supporting congregations' contributions are strictly voluntary and subject to change each month. Furthermore, we have some individual contributors, and using the Consumer Groups' rationale, the Seeking the Lost Ministries would have to obtain full financial documentation from every single donor who ever donated.

The irony of it all is that the Seeking the Lost ministries would be happy to provide closed captioning, if it was affordable.
