I am writing you in support of Charter's plan to acquire Time Warner Cable Inc., and Bright House Networks LLC. I feel the merger will have a positive impact on the consumers that are served currently by Charter Communications.

The Youth Attention Center (referred to as YAC) is a non-profit agency that works with runaway, homeless and at-risk youth in Mecosta and Osceola Counties in rural Michigan. YAC is committed to meeting the needs of eligible homeless, runaway, and at-risk youth and their families through a network of supportive outreach, crisis and case management services. We strive to promote and support family connections, encourage positive daily living in a safe home environment and provide fundamental life skills that inspire youth to achieve their goals.

Charter has been vital in providing services to youth and their families in times of crisis. We have an on call line that can be accessed by any youth or family in a crisis situation any time day or night. Youth rely on this access when they are on the streets and need to find a safe place to stay. Charter has helped YAC reach out to youth through social media on multiple occasions. Youth are more apt to check their Facebook or email account on a daily basis and can get in contact with their Caseworker.

Charter Communications donated funds to YAC earlier this year which went directly to help youth in needs. The funds donated supplied youth with clothes, food to eat, vital documents to help obtain housing and employment among other necessities.

The Youth Attention Center is in support of the merger between Charter, Time Warner and Bright House Network.
