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As a time Warner Cable customer I am worried about the changes in price to my service. I only have internet with Time Warner and I pay \$14.99 a month with their Everyday Low Price plan. This low cost internet is the backbone to how I connect with the world. I use this connection for my VOIP phone, PC, and streaming television.

Many will say that 2 Mbps for a download speed is not even broadband anymore, but I use Hulu and Netflix without any problem. I do not need a faster and thus a more expensive plan. Having a greater download speed does not change the speed of surfing the web and, in fact, it is not even noticeable. I convinced my friend to downgrade from 30 Mbps down to the Everyday Low cost plan. He also noticed no difference in the quality of their service.

I am greatly concerned that this merger will require me to pay much more for my internet. Charter only offers high speed plans that I do not need. These plans cost about 4 times as much as I am paying now. My greatest wish in terms of this merger is that my low cost internet plan remains intact. I understand that Charter put in an incentive to try to pass this merger. They are going to include a no fee modem. Simply including a modem that is a \$60 up front cost is not changing my mind about this merger that will cost consumers much more over time. Based on my potential increase in cost for internet service, I would pay Charter for the cost of this Modem in under two months. It seems like less of a deal now doesn't it?

Please ensure that Charter does not prevent me from accessing the internet affordably. I know many of my friends and family who depend on Time Warner's Everyday Low Price plan. If this plan will not continue to be offered permanently then I cannot support his merger.
