Dear Ms. Dortch:

Pursuant to 47 C.F.R. § 64.606(f)(2), CaptionCall, LLC (“CaptionCall”) hereby notifies the Commission of a substantive change to its Internet Protocol Captioned Telephone Service (“IP CTS”). On September 1, 2015, CaptionCall began widely distributing its new fixed IP CTS endpoint, telephone model 67T, which CaptionCall now distributes in place of legacy phone models 57T and 57TX. In addition to the feature sets of previous models, the 67T provides several new features, including:

- A speakerphone;
- A dedicated on/off button for captions;
- A dedicated volume knob for the handset, speakerphone, and ringer; and
- A setting to allow users to receive Spanish-language captions by default.

As of September 1, 2015, CaptionCall is using 67T phones for the majority of new customers and is no longer manufacturing or selling model 57T phones. Customers may also purchase 67T phones, but CaptionCall is not upgrading existing customers’ phones.
