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Comment: In creating the new policies, please consider how the FCC can help simplify the process of complying with regulations for individuals and hobbyists, especially students, looking to create their own devices. The new guidelines have not adequately considered the effect this will have on future independent development, and continue the present trend of unfairly discriminating against amateurs and students, like Ahmed Mohammed, of recent publicity for his arrest in bringing a homemade watch to school. At present, the proposed changes DISCOURAGE STUDENTS FROM PURSUING STEM PROFESSIONS, through the intimidation of noncompliance. Students and amateurs are unfairly burdened by the effort required to comply, because the policies are written in a manner that discourages them. As a result, science and engineering become less desirable to children as they become adults; it's too difficult to stay out of trouble.
