Dear Ms. Dortch:

On October 15, 2015, Rick Chessen of the National Cable & Telecommunications Association, Andy Clegg of Google Inc., David Don of Comcast Corporation, Emmett O’Keefe of Cablevision Systems Corporation, and I met with Erin McGrath, Legal Advisor to Commissioner O’Rielly, and Johanna Thomas, Legal Advisor to Commissioner Rosenworcel. On October 19, Paula Boyd of Microsoft Corporation, Mr. Chessen, Mr. Don, Mr. O’Keefe, and I met with Louis Peraertz, Legal Advisor to Commissioner Clyburn, and Brendan Carr, Legal Advisor to Commissioner Pai. In each meeting, we discussed that: (1) while the group does not oppose LTE in unlicensed bands, the standards-setting process is the path to both protecting consumers and supporting innovation; (2) the LTE-U Forum was not a standards organization, had restricted membership, and did not engage in the type of coordination needed to protect consumers; and (3) CableLabs and Google testing demonstrates that LTE-U specification-compliant devices would substantially undermine Wi-Fi consumers.
