My name is David Fetter and I live in Oakland, CA.

The principles of user choice and control are vitally important for a vibrant wireless ecosystem. But as written, the NPRM threatens to undermine these ideals by limiting what users can do with their devices. That's a concern, because I don't want to see community innovations, such as mesh networking, get cut off.

The draft rules could enable device manufacturers to forbid third-party software, which would make me feel less safe about the wireless networks I use and operate.

This plan may be well-intentioned, but it will do tremendous damage if enacted, and the damage will accrue even after it's repealed. It's also a flagrant and terrible violation of people's rights of self-expression, that expression being done through software code.
