The principles of user choice and control are vitally important for a vibrant wireless ecosystem. But as written, the NPRM threatens to undermine these ideals by limiting what users can do with their devices. That's a concern, because I want to be able to update my own wireless software?not rely on slow manufacturers shipping updates.

The draft rules could enable device manufacturers to forbid third-party software, which would make me feel less safe about the wireless networks I use and operate.

To me it is a matter of having control over the hardware our businesses purchase to provide a safer work environment. Manufacturers often lag in updating their respective product, after a vulnerability has been made known. If you go forth with locking all hardware, irrespective of intent, the FCC creates potential vulnerabilities that may end up with legal challenges against the FCC.
