
Dear Chairman Wheeler,

I am writing this letter to express my support for the proposed merger of Charter Communications, Time Warner Cable and Bright House Networks into New Charter. As a member of the Maine House of Representatives, I am very focused on supporting companies that will increase economic development in our state. Now in my third term, I recognize the many benefits that this transaction will bring to our state and consumers throughout Maine. These benefits will include faster broadband service with no data caps or usage-based pricing, a commitment to net neutrality, new investments in customer service, and plans to aggressively rollout advanced technologies (ex. WiFi deployment).
